<i>white wampum pr. D° -----</i>	<i>2 otters or 7 racoons</i>
<i>Large cutteaus, or knives -----</i>	<i>a doeskin or two large racoons</i>
<i>Small knives for Women -----</i>	<i>one small beaver or 9 large racoons</i>
<i>one piece of best roll gartering -----</i>	<i>two large racoons, or one marten</i>
<i>2 fathom of ribband -----</i>	<i>one large racoon, or three muskrat</i>
<i>one pound of vermilion -----</i>	<i>one small racoon, or two muskrats</i>
<i>one piece of ordinary gartering, or gimp</i>	<i>one beaver, or two doeskins, or</i>
<i>one fathom of calico -----</i>	<i>6 racoons</i>
<i>one Do of callinancoe -----</i>	<i>one buck, or middlesized beaver</i>
<i>a large silk handkerchief -----</i>	<i>two beavers, or three bucks</i>
<i>brass kettles by weight -----</i>	<i>one small beaver, or 4 racoons</i>
<i>tin, or camp kettles of a gallon -----</i>	<i>one beaver, or three doeskins</i>
